BIX Routing



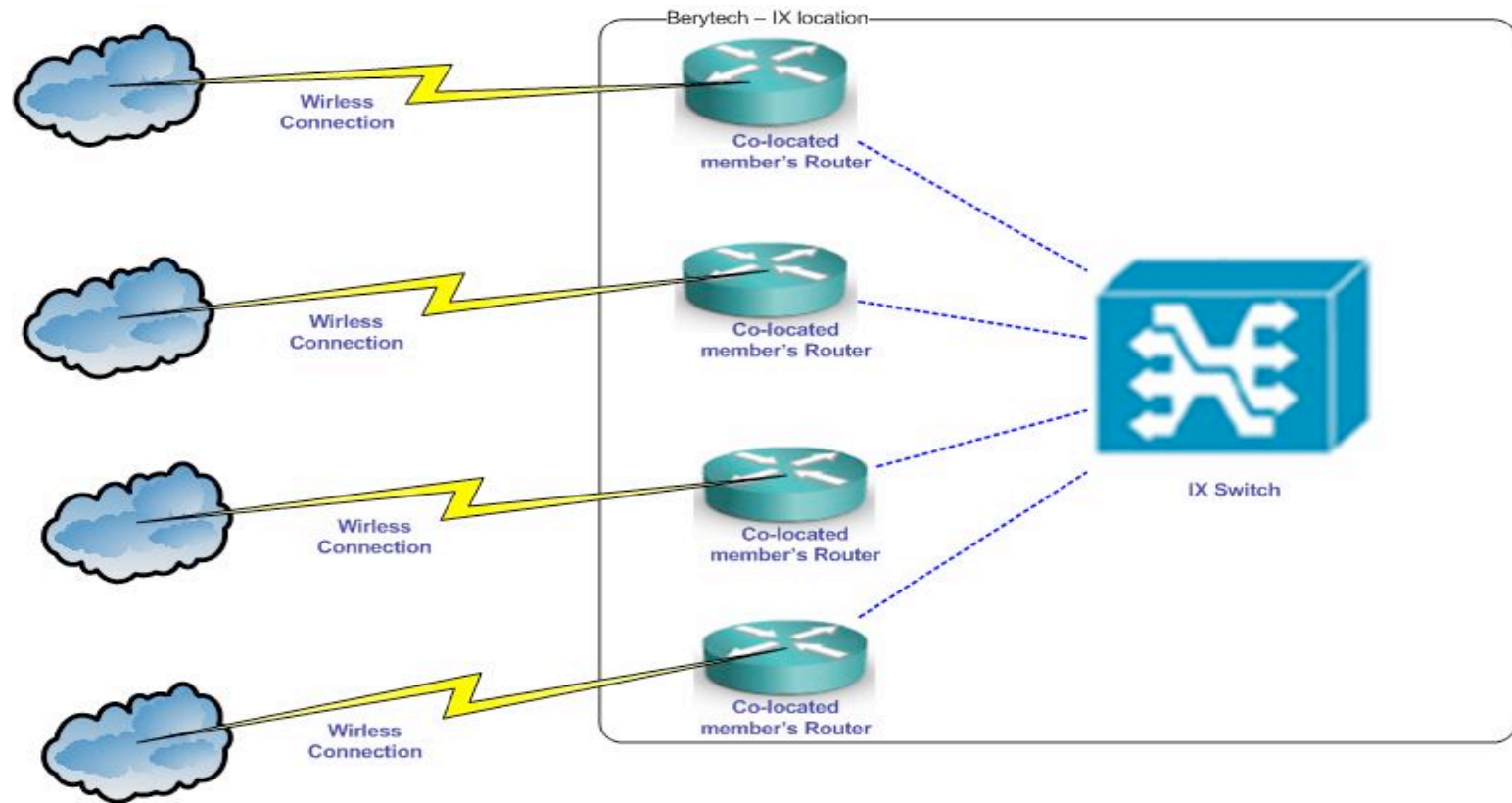
- Members use their AS numbers and IP address assigned by Ripe
- Interfaces connected to the IX use IP addresses assigned by the IXP MOC
- Bilateral peering between IX members

BIX Benefits



- Peering decreases Bandwidth cost: Optimum utilization of International Bandwidth
- Improving quality of service: Traffic between ISPs has lower latency
- Provide basic infrastructure for .lb and other government initiatives
- Stimulate the growth of local content

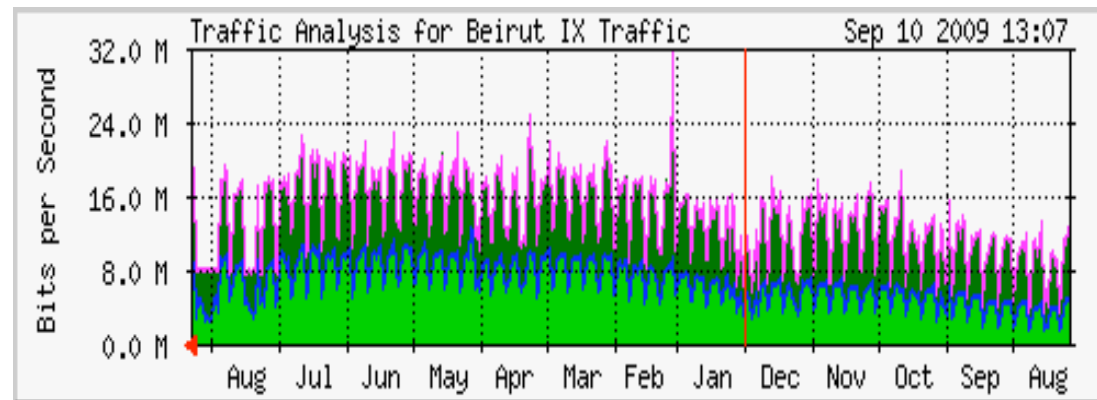
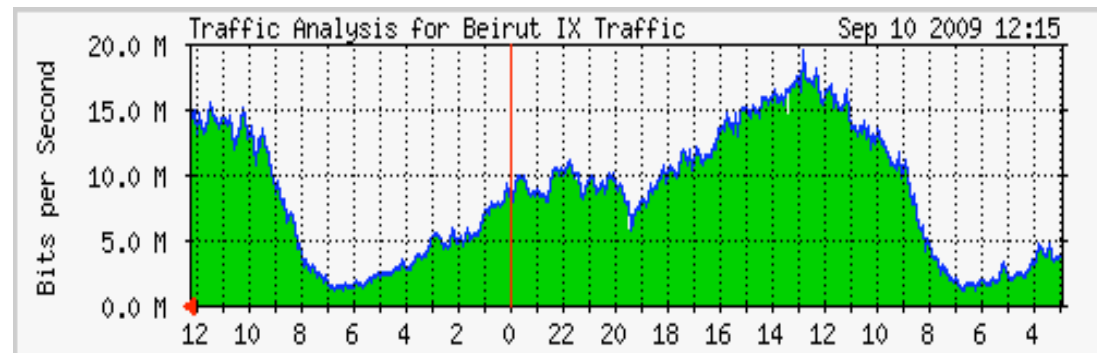

Statistics



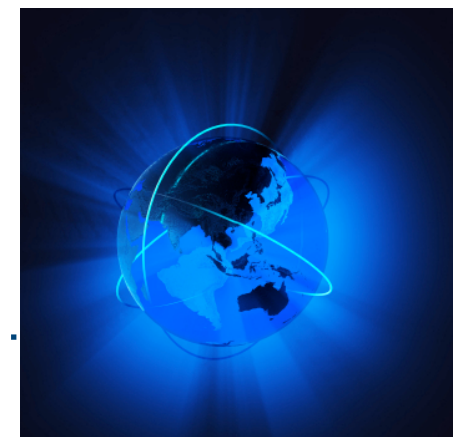
- BIX Traffic doubled during the last year
