Sudan Network Operator Group


- Non-profit Group, Managed and organized by volunteers.
- Aims to provide an open platform for knowledge sharing, capacity building, and technical collaboration in Sudan.

Objectives:

- To bring together the region's network engineers in a functional technical community
- To enhance the quality of Internet services available in Sudan by exchanging of technical ideas and information between different companies and organisations.
- To provide network education, capacity building and knowledge transfer
- Promotion of the use of open source within the technical community.

The origin of SdNOG

- The current situation in Sudan
 - Sudan Special Case (Sanctions).
 - There is different ICT Players and initiatives operating with isolation from each other.
 - Sudan has many resources and technical capacity that is not fully utilized.
- A group of volunteers realized that there needs to be a platform to discuss these issues.
- SdNOG was conceived.

- SdNOG started by a group of volunteers.
- An "Executive committee" was formed to draw out the general proposal of the group and lay out the vision, mission and objectives of the group.
- The main roles that were defined are:
 - Head of the committee:
 - Finance officer
 - Event coordinator
 - Administrative officer / secretariats
 - Technical officer

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- The general Plan was to register SdNOG as an independent group.
- Depending on Sudan environment it was better to register the group under the umbrella of an existing entity.
- The Sudanese Internet Society (SIS) was chosen as a governing body for SdNOG as an unbiased entity.
- the logo and the letterhead were designed at this phase.

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- Design a website to hold the basic information about the group.
- Two mailing list were created:
 - General mailing list (SdNOG) Public which is the main mailing list to be used by any interested individual.
 - Executive Committee mailing list Private for planning, organizing and managing the workflow for the group

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- Choosing the type of event.
 - Conference only.
 - Workshop + conference
- The launching event was chosen to be a two day conference
- Setting the date.
 - The date were chosen to make sure that they don't coincide with other important events in the region

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


SdNOG-1
