

# RIPE NCC Membership Overview






- Unprecedented growth in 2018
- Membership projected to reach 24,000 LIRs by end 2019




# Membership in the Middle East






### IPv4 Addresses Overview








### IPv6 RIPEness



- Awarding stars based on IPv6 preparedness
- 1 star: Having an IPv6 allocation or assignment from the RIPE NCC
- 2 stars: Visibility in the Routing Information Service (RIS)
- 3 stars: Having a ROUTE6 object in the RIPE Database
- 4 stars: Having a reverse DNS delegation set up
- There is now a fifth star for deploying IPv6 at the edge

# Our Strategic Focus for 2019



- Preparing for strong membership growth and anticipated fall-off after our IPv4 pool is finished
- Ensuring accuracy of the RIPE Registry
- Focus on due diligence and fraud prevention
- Adding value through our training services
- Providing neutral information, tools and measurements to support the RIPE community
- Strengthening the K-root server infrastructure

# Simplifying our Billing Processes



- Annual-only billing process from 2019
- A strong need to focus on efficiency as our membership continues to grow
- Support offered to help members with financial constraints make the transition
- Membership fee is much less than when quarterly payment options were first introduced (especially considering return of budget surplus to membership)

# Outreach in the MENOG region



- Government Roundtable held in Saudi Arabia in Dec 2018
- Saudi Arabia country report published at the Roundtable
- Member lunch in Dubai in 2018
- Roundtable discussion on online security for banks, and "IPv6 Week" held in Lebanon
- Face-to-face training courses held in Dubai, Muscat,
  Riyadh, Beirut, Doha, Istanbul, Amman in 2018

# Policy Implementation: Abuse-C Validation



- Implementation started in February 2019
- Initial check of over 70,000 contacts
- Automated validation emails sent to abuse contacts that fail this check
- Manual follow-up by our staff if these abuse contacts are not updated
- Please check the abuse contacts for your LIR and customers and look out for any emails from us about this!

### E-Learning



- Expanding our e-learning activities
- Webinars and a new online academic partnership model with the American University of Beirut (AUB)
- Remote, online certifications for RIPE NCC e-learning courses
- Launching in late 2019 early 2020

# **Current Policy Proposals**




- 2018-06: Aims to delete non-authoritative objects in the RIPE IRR if they conflict with an RPKI ROA
- 2019-01: Clarification of the definition of "Assigned PA"
- 2019-02: Aims to reduce the IPv4 allocation size to a /24 once the RIPE NCC is unable to allocate contiguous /22 ranges
- 2019-03: Defines BGP Hijacking as a violation of RIPE policy


# Have your say

# RIPE NCC Survey: Tell us what you think!




- Our last survey gathered input from 4,400 people
